Pastor Hal writes

LIVING LIFE RENEWED

With the coming of Spring and in the glow of Easter, I thought I would share some thoughts about the what the new life through faith in Jesus looks like in our daily walk. Paul writes in Romans 12:1-2 *"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercies, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God – this is true worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what is God's will – his good, pleasing and perfect will."*

This new life that emerges as a result of our baptism and the faith that is implanted and nurtured by the Holy Spirit reflects a profound life change, a change that includes living in a way that reflects what we say we believe. One of the values that we reflect is that we have the courage to live our lives in a way that honors our God. That courage is reflected in a section of a book by Eric Harvey and Steve Ventura entitled *Walk the Talk*. In it they write:

Courage is...

- Following your conscience instead of "following the crowd".
- Refusing to take part in hurtful or disrespectful behaviors.
- Sacrificing personal gain for the benefit of others.
- Speaking your mind even though others don't agree.
- Taking complete responsibility for your actions...and your mistakes.
- Following the rules – and insisting that others do the same.
- Challenging the status quo in search of better ways.
- Doing what you know is right - regardless of the risks and potential consequences.

This, dear people, is a life changed by the Risen Savior. This is a life that does not let the world squeeze us into its mold but rather impacts the world around us because we are changed at the core. This is the life that has been transformed by the grace of God. This is a life that lives out the talk of change, deep change. This is a conscience shaped by the Spirit and nurtured and developed in the Word of God. Let's commit to spring into action as shapers of our families, our workplaces, our sporting venues, as we live lives transformed by the Risen Savior.

Pastor John writes

FOR IT IS GOD WHO IS AT WORK IN YOU!!!

Philippians 2:13

Profound! Amazing! This is true of ME!! of YOU!! Think about this truth. It is God Who is at work in you! God indwells us - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! My body, your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit (I Corinthians 6:19). We are, I am, you are indwelt of God.

Not only does God INDWELL me, but He is "at work" in us. Doing what?

What kind of work is He doing in us? "Enabling me both to will and to work for His good pleasure." He touches my will so that I want to do what He wills me to do. "What do You have in mind for me today, Lord," I ask of Him daily. The Holy Spirit tunes my will, so that it is in tune with His will. Amazing, but true! Now with my will in tune with His will, I seek out those tasks He sends across my path today. I do these tasks in His name and to His glory, and do them gladly. I am doing for the Holy Spirit some tasks He wants done, sometimes for me, and also for others. Also I am eager to do these tasks for Him; it's my privilege, it's my pleasure. "It is God Who is at work in me." That's really something, isn't it?

I do His works "for His good pleasure". At the close of the day He says to me, placing His hands of blessing upon me, "Well done, John, good and faithful servant, well done!" I feel grateful; I feel good. It's been a good day of working for the Lord.

Not all the tasks He assigns are easy; some are tough, they require effort and dedication, and sometimes super human power. The power is there, provided by Him for me. His power within me is even greater than any challenge before me (I John 4:4).

This concept of Philippians 2:13 changes my entire day. I am working first and foremost for the Holy Spirit, doing what He wills me to do. Every task and chore, every assignment glorifies the name of our Lord and triune God. We are doing it because "if any man be in Christ he is a new creature" (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Have a good day! You will have, because you are working for the greatest Boss in the world – the Lord God.

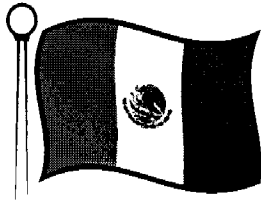
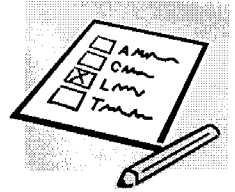
Dear Redeemer Families,

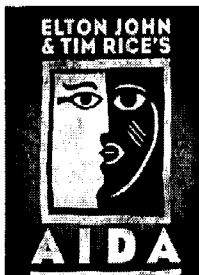

COOL TIPS FROM COOL FAMILIES

Summer travel season is almost here, and spring break is upon us. Everything you do is a little more challenging when you travel, including recycling and saving energy. Here are a few tips to help you reduce the greenhouse gases you generate when you travel. Remember, transportation and home heating/cooling are the biggest contributors to your carbon footprint.

Tip #1: Choose an efficient car. If you travel by car, start by choosing the most energy efficient vehicle that is safe and appropriate for your trip. Follow our previous tips, and make sure the tires have appropriate air pressure.

Tip #2: Turn off home air conditioning or heat. If you whole family is leaving the house: Turn off heat & air conditioning entirely if possible; or adjust it to a lower setting to protect pipes from freezing or to make sure pets stay healthy. Turn water heater to "Vacation" or lowest setting; and unplug appliances, such as TVs, computers and set-top boxes - they use power even when they are turned off.

Tip #3: Pack light. Especially if you are flying, don't overpack. It takes a lot of fuel to move the extra weight across the miles.

Tip #4: Try camping! Consider staying closer to home for your vacation destination. There are so many amazing places to visit in California, check out someplace nearby that you've always been meaning to visit. Camping can be a terrific, eco-friendly vacation.

Tip #5: Reduce power use in your hotel: If you stay in a hotel:

- Ask housekeeping not to replace your sheets and towels every day; this reduces energy AND water usage.
- Turn off the lights, air conditioner or heater, and the electronics in your room while you're out.
- Turn off the water when you brush your teeth, and take a shorter showers.
- Bring your own toiletries, or, if you use what the hotel provides, take leftover items home with you.

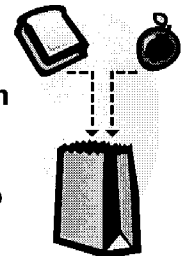

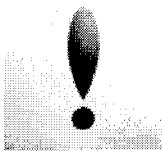

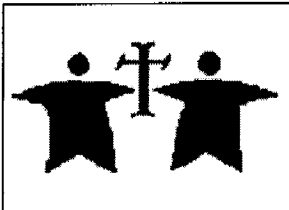

Daily Schedule: Day camps run from 9:00am-12:00pm. Each program will include activity time, recreational time and group prayer.

Snack: We will provide one (1) snack each day. If your child has special nutritional needs, please send them with an appropriate snack.

Cost: For enrollment on or before May 15, 2008, each session is \$150.00. (2 week session \$300.00). After May 15, 2008 each session is \$175.00 (2 week session \$350).

Deposit: \$25.00 of each session's fee is a **non-refundable, non-transferable deposit**. In the event of a cancellation, this deposit will be retained by Redeemer Lutheran Ministries for administrative costs.

Cancellations: Cancellation requiring a refund must be delivered in writing to the church office 24 hours or more in advance of the session start date. Cancellations after the start of the session, or if the child withdraws during the session cannot be guaranteed a refund, and will be addressed on a case by case basis.

Payment Due Date: Payment in full is due by the first day of the session. A position in the program will not be guaranteed until payment in full has been received. There are a limited number of spaces available and will be filled on a first payment received basis. We accept checks, money orders or cash.
