## LENT: A SEASON FOR RETOOLING AND GROWTH

Lent is upon us with its 40 days of reflection and drawing closer to our God in repentance and through the exercise of spiritual disciplines of prayer and meditation. We have two ways to focus ourselves and recalibrate how we live out our relationship with the Lord. One is to be involved in one of the small group gatherings in homes to discuss the Sunday theme of **40 DAYS OF LOVE**. The small groups will extend the message that comes the previous Sunday. Even if groups have already begun, it is not too late to participate.

On Wednesday nights we have messages that focus on being Christians who are making a strong impact empowered by the Lord in their daily walk. In the Book of Revelation, God speaks to the community of faith at Laodicea and challenges it to heat up its life. He says, *"I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other!"* He challenges them to reach the boiling point, where they generate steam, the steam that can power a locomotive. We will look at **LIVING LIFE AT THE BOILING POINT**, generating energy that transforms the community through the power of the Holy Spirit. The evening worship time will be preceded each Wednesday with soup suppers prepared by Hank and Lina Lassalle. Great food, great fellowship, and messages that relate to life drawing on God's Word!!

Plan to engage in both Sunday and Wednesday worship and in small groups - your life will be "hot!"

## **JOY AND PEACE – TWO BLESSINGS FROM THE LORD**

A Christian is a very joyful and very happy person. Would you agree? At least he can, and he should be. St. Paul encourages, "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, rejoice." (Philippians 4:4) In the liturgy of Matins we invite one another saying, "O come, let us sing unto the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the Rock of our salvation." (Psalm 95)

In addition the Christian possesses "the peace of God which passeth all understanding." St. Paul assures us, "Therefore having been justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 5:1) Peace is an inner emotion which calms one's spirit especially in times of stress.

Two priceless gifts - joy and peace! They come to us - how? Through the grace and undeserved mercy of God. Something has happened to us which always brings joy and peace to us. Again Paul speaks of this in Romans 6:3-6. Read these verses carefully. Something cataclysmic has happened to us. The Holy Spirit has made us into brand new totally changed people. "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ, have been baptized into His DEATH!" Our baptism has caused us to share in Christ's death on the cross. He, Jesus, died; but when He died on the cross also a part of us died at our baptism, the old man, the old Adam, the natural man. That part of us DIED! Also, through our baptism we also participate in Christ's burial. "Having been buried with Him through baptism into death." (Romans 6:4) Our old nature died and also has been buried through our baptism. But there is more - we also participate through our baptism in Christ's RESURRECTION! Just as Christ rose from the dead, we too arise from the death of the old nature, that is to say, the new man, the new person, the new I arise with Jesus. This new person is so different, is new, he loves the Lord, he walks and lives in newness of life. Romans 6:4 - ... "as Christ was raised from the dead...so we too might walk in newness of life."

In other words, the Holy Spirit has, in our conversion, made us into brand new people, redeemed, saved, loving the Lord, forgiven by the Father's act of justification, and now at the side of Jesus, loving, acting, walking, speaking, thinking as Jesus does. "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things have passed away; behold new things have come." (2 Corinthians 5:17).

That is why we now have these two wonderful new traits. We are always REJOICING, and we always have the PEACE OF GOD, which passeth all understanding.

But now a problem rears its head, a spiritual problem. Why does Paul seem to lose his joy at times and also his peace? Read his lament in Romans 7:15, "That which I am doing I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate." That type of emotion happens to me too and possibly also to you. The problem is our sins. We still sin, even though we are wonderfully remade people of God. And when this happens we lose our peace and our joy – for a time. Listen to Paul's lament, "Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death." (Romans 7:24)

That's when we cry out to Lord, "Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation." (Psalm 51:12 - Liturgy) And the dear loving Lord does that very thing; He restores our JOY and our PEACE. Paul assures himself and us, "There is therefore no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." (Romans 8:1) Because Jesus won for us, through His suffering, death, and resurrection - forgiveness! I am forgiven - always. "The blood of Jesus cleanses us (keeps on cleansing us) from all sin." (1 John 1:7) So I can sing again, and I have peace, "Being justified as a gift by His grace, through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus" (Romans 3:24).

I simply wanted to share this great truth with you. I am always standing in grace, under the Father's judicial act of declaring me forgiven, because of Jesus Christ; I am ALWAYS DECLARED FORGIVEN! The Holy Spirit wants us to know this wonderful truth, and to be joyful. And to have the peace of God that surpasses all understanding.

## **WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR**

*Luke 10:25-37*

Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan always seemed a little too simple. Perhaps this was because I usually heard it in the context of, "Be nice to everyone," but as I have learned more about this particular story, it turns out that I was missing a crucial part of what Luke was saying. In verse 29, Luke tells us: *But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"*

It is only then that Jesus tells the parable. In other words, the answer to the question of "Who is my neighbor?" *is the story itself*. The Jewish scholars of Jesus time considered the question of one's neighbor to be remarkably important. After all, it is one of the commandments. The scholars would obsess over these commands, trying to understand what God is wanting and requiring. Is my neighbor the person who lives next door to me? Yes. What about the people across the street? Probably. My co-workers? Maybe. People living in the next county? Maybe not. You get the picture.

This was typical. They sought to understand how best to execute the commandments God gave them, and it was Jesus who was trying to change the direction of their focus. God wanted the people's hearts more than anything else, even more than the proper execution of rules and commands.

So when the hero of the parable turns out to be the Samaritan, the ethnic group that lived north of Judea and whom the Jews hated, Jesus isn't offering an answer. *Instead, he is changing the question*. Loving your neighbor is less about taking care of those nearest to you, who are easy to love because you know them well. Instead, it is about caring for those you encounter, wherever and whomever they happen to be.

After all, it wasn't the pious men that avoided the beaten man on the road that stopped to help him. They weren't "neighbors." It was the Samaritan, who supposedly was ignorant to God's laws that demonstrated real love for his neighbor.

So, who is your neighbor?

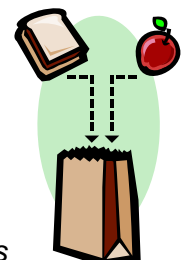
